

Cultural Heritage Working Group

Established February 2010, the Cultural Heritage Working Group will take the lead in fostering discussion, clarifying issues, and investigating a range of alternative approaches to managing, preserving, and providing access to cultural heritage, given the rights and responsibilities of cultural groups and stakeholders and archivists' interest in providing equal and open access to all.

This group will:

- Advise the SAA Council, officers, staff, and members concerning cultural heritage and cultural sensitivity issues;
- Prepare draft statements for SAA to issue;
- Develop positions for SAA concerning cultural heritage and cultural sensitivity issues;
- Represent SAA on cultural heritage and cultural sensitivity issues at meetings and in professional discussions; and
- Communicate and collaborate with all relevant SAA and external (ALA, AAM, etc.) groups.



LAMP

The Latin American Materials Project (LAMP) acquires, preserves, and maintains microform and digital collections of unique, rare, and bulky or voluminous Latin American research materials for its members. LAMP emphasizes original preservation, either through microfilming or digitization, though it may also purchase existing microfilm. LAMP bases its activities on annual membership fees. The geographic scope of LAMP includes all of Latin America, including the Caribbean region and Central America.

LAMP, formed in 1975, has conducted projects in cooperation with Latin American repositories and now devotes greater attention to preserving primary source materials, such as political archives. While LAMP's holdings are widely representative of the region, its Brazilian materials, Haitian imprints, and annual ministerial reports from all countries are particularly extensive. LAMP has digitized a substantial body of Brazilian materials already in microform to expand access.

Some LAMP microfilm is available for purchase. For more information, see [Microform Sales](#).

LARRP

The Latin Americanist Research Resources Project (LARRP) is a consortium of research libraries that seeks to increase free and open access to information in support of learning and scholarship in Latin American Studies. It mobilizes collaborative activities among individuals and organizations on a global scale but focuses on relationships within the academic library community.



LARRP achieves its mission by:

- Providing access to information that supports all forms of scholarship
- Promoting free and equitable access to these resources for the global scholarly community
- Actively seeking partnerships with institutions that contribute to the flow of information

LARRP projects include:

- **Latin American Periodicals Tables of Contents (LAPTOC)**
LAPTOC, a searchable Web database, provides access to the tables of contents of 975 journals, primarily in the humanities and social sciences, published in Latin America.
- **Latin American Open Archives Portal (LAOAP)**
LAOAP, a portal service, provides access to social sciences grey literature produced in Latin America by research institutes, nongovernmental organizations, and peripheral agencies. It encompasses working documents, pre-prints, research papers, statistical documents, and other difficult-to-access materials not controlled by commercial publishers.
- **Presidential Messages**
The Presidential Messages database contains digital images of more than 75,000 pages of Mexican and Argentinian presidential speeches from the early 19th century to the present.
- **Distributed Resources**
An agreement between participating North American libraries designed to strengthen the collective coverage of monographs and other resources produced in Latin America. Through the concerted reallocation of library collection budgets, enhanced coverage of "noncore" materials is provided in an interconnected network of collections. The participants also provide online bibliographic records as quickly as possible and make the majority of these materials available through interlibrary loan.
- **LARRP Services**
A list of potential services and products that may become available for interested LARRP participants. Information about LARRP Services is available on the LARRP Workspace.

LARRP's annual Members Meetings are held at Seminar on the Acquisition of Latin American Library Materials conferences. Meeting Minutes and other information related to the ongoing work of LARRP may be found in the LARRP Workspace.
